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## **Renewable Energy Company Broadens Search For Clean Energy Facility Site**

Anaergia notified planning officials they are temporarily putting on hold the environmental review of their proposed Lakeview Avenue facility, providing an opportunity for the company to evaluate additional sites within and outside of Anaheim.

Given that cities throughout California are required develop sustainable energy solutions, while at the same time diverting organic waste from local landfills, anaerobic digestion is the perfect solution. Anaergia Services generates clean energy using its proprietary anaerobic digestion technology by processing pre-treated food waste through an OREX processor, which extracts the nutrients and moisture from the waste, creating the oatmeal-like textured feedstock. In turn the materials will be used to facilitate the anaerobic digestion, which generates low-pressure renewal energy in the form of biogas.

“Anaerobic digestion has been successfully used throughout California for many years. By 2019, nearly every commercial business that generates food waste in California, including restaurants and apartment communities, will be required to participate in a diversion program.
